

For someone who is not real familiar with the books of the bible, this book is great! I ordered 2, one for myself and one for my Son in Law. Each book is broken down in to sections such as, who Authored the book, the approximate date it was written, a 10 WORDS OR LESS summary and also a detailed account of each book. They give you quotable verses as well. I recommend this product for anyone that feels unfamiliar with the books of the bible and want to know more, or someone who is younger and just really learning. It's a great read!!

I am reviewing this book because it doesn't make sense not to.... If that makes sense ... ?? This book has been around for about seven or eight years (more or less..). In that time it has sold a bunch of copies (millions..??). That means that it has been fairly well received. There is a reason for that.....This book is short, clean, and concise. It tells exactly the same thing about each book of the Bible starting with Genesis and ending with Revelation. There are 1-2 pages dedicated to each book of the Bible. Each book entry follows the same format of seven specific topic reference points.

Author:Date:**In Ten Words or Less:**Details, Please:**Quotable:**Unique and Unusual:**So What?:**Since all of this information is contained on 1-2 pages, it stands to reason that each book entry has precious little detail. That is exactly what the author intended, and exactly what he accomplished. In each of the seven points there is something specific and unique about that particular book of the Bible. For example: In 1 and 2 Kings we find the following statements under the heading of "In Ten Words or Less" 1 Kings: "Israel divides into rival northern and southern nations". And in 2 Kings we find: "Both Jewish nations are destroyed for their disobedience to God." Later, in the New Testament entries, we find in the book of 2 Timothy: "The apostle Paul's final words to a beloved co-worker." The same type of entries are present for every book of the Bible. It is hard to imagine that much of anything useful could be contained in a small book of 95 total pages that would shed any light on a book so profound as the Bible. Yet, this effort deserves a place in the study works of Christians everywhere. It is not complete. It does not tell the stories. It does not offer the spiritual guidance. What it does is stimulate the desire for more. It gives you a jumping off place for further study. It gives you a quick look at the "Who" and "Why" and "Where" of each book of the Bible and allows you to quickly determine if your question's answer might be present in that book. It is not the study material itself, but rather an outline for you to fill in. I find it immensely useful as a primer for showing/teaching others about the Bible, and as a quick refresher when my mind needs it. Unless you have a photographic memory or are blessed with fabulous mnemonic help, you will find this little book to be a very useful partner in your study. Recommended.

I bought this little gem at my local Christian bookstore. Who knew that something so cheap could be so jam packed with useful information? I am 30 years old and have never read the Bible cover to cover. After joining a church & becoming actively involved in it last summer, I am a sponge, wanting nothing more than to soak up as much insight as possible to further strengthen my relationship with Christ. I've heard of certain parables and stories within the Bible, (like Samson & Delilah, David & Goliath, etc.) but never knew which book they were in or which verses to read. Also, in my Bible

study, I've learned that a little background and history research will work wonders for understanding certain books within the Bible. Who the author is, what his life was like, what the world was like during his life, etc. This book pulls out the no-nonsense, bare-bones facts of each book of the Bible. If you have not read the Bible cover to cover like me, and want to learn how to study your Bible, you need the basics first. This little book provides the basics, and beyond...

The Bible has over a thousand chapters which is a lot of information to digest. However this book will help you get a quick handle on what's going on in each of its sixty-six books. How is the book set up? Well, each of the sixty-six books of the Bible gets explained in 1-2 pages. On these pages, the book follows an outline that covers seven items:-the author-the date when the book was written-in ten words or less what each book's key theme is-details of the key events, people, and messages of that particular book (this is the longest section)-several key verses from that particular book-any unique and unusual facts in the book-and an inspirational or devotional thought for each book. Know that this is a small and short book, but then again, that's the whole point of it. It is meant to give you a nice, concise synopsis of each book of the Bible - and I felt like it succeeds nicely in doing just that. Other short books I really liked include: The Prayer Project: How Each One of Us Can Make The World a Better Place to Live - In a Few Minutes a Day.

if you're reading from a Bible that doesn't contain an introduction or summary to each book, then Know your Bible is what you need to become a little more knowledgeable. Know your Bible introduces a summary containing Authors (who wrote each book), When it was written (Date), A brief description (In Ten Words or Less), Book details (What's it about), Quotes, Unique and Unusual details and a So What? section. if your Bible doesn't have an introduction or summary, then I say this book is worth getting. But, if you own a Study Bible or a Bible with an introduction feature, then this book is not needed. On an end note, Know your Bible is small enough to carry around in your pocket, and is extremely affordable...I highly recommend it!

This is easy to read and each book is dressed by author, dates, and background and an overall explanation of the big picture of the book in question and even how it plays into with others in front and back of it. It gives a final opinion of the book also. It's not too small, nor too big. I would say there isn't more than one page, front and back, some a little more so you're looking at about 200pgs or less. Nice ref. book for studies of any kind. I love it.
