If Aristotle's Metaphysics is difficult (and it is - at least for this student) then Aquinas' Commentary at the very least must be said to make it possible to understand. This is a brilliant work which should be read by those who wish to understand the arguments that Aristotle and Aquinas offer in support

of the proposition that God exists. I do not think that the argument presented here is easily dismissed. As a warning to prospective readers: I strongly advise you to acquire a general familiarity with Aristotle's works and philosophy before attempting this, lest the background arguments previously established by the authors present obstacles to understanding what is discussed in this book. The *Metaphysics* was not written in a philosophical vacuum; rather it builds upon principles and conclusions established elsewhere (most especially but not exclusively in the *Physics* and *On the Soul*). God exists. Aristotle and Aquinas show this to be the case. What follows as a consequence of this awesome fact is a subject of other works.
