

Unfortunately this was not what I expected of a Garwood book. I feel like the characters were not as developed as they are normally. Compared to *The Bride*, *The Wedding*, *The Secret*, and *Ransom*, this book paled in comparison. It's unfortunate. The ending left me wanting better closure to the story and the issues that lingered. The few love scenes sounded like repetitive clips from previous books. It failed to get my blood going like the other books have so often done. Hopefully this helps.

This story didn't have as much action as some of her other books, but it was still an enjoyable story.

This story and "Ransom" are two of my all time favorite reads! I recommend this book to anyone looking for a wonderful love story!
