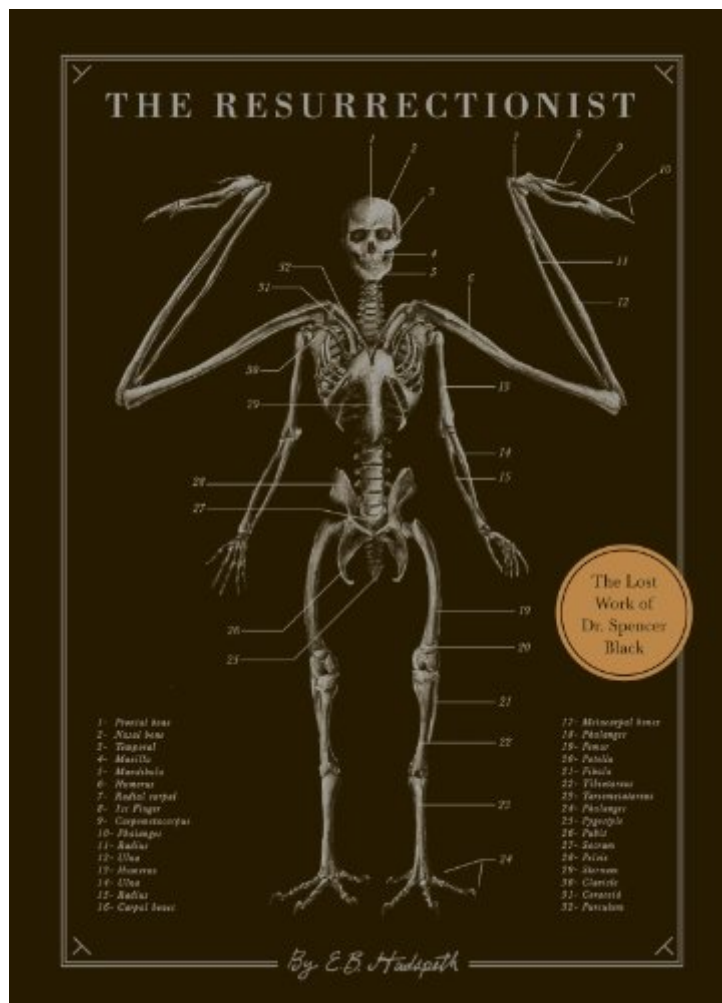

The story, though fictional, conveys compelling evidence for the many possibilities of human evolutionary history. However, that is not to say one should interpret the readings of this short novel as literal truth but as mere questions of possibility. Mythology can usually be linked to some form of the truth. So, why should these possibilities be ruled out? Nonetheless, this was an incredibly interesting read, especially for those who dare to question the many possibilities of the human origin.

The art in this book is fantastic, my teen children were fascinated by the drawings. but the story was just a little dull and the "Wow" at the end had no wow factor at all for us. We kept it for awhile to browse the pictures and have gotten rid of it now. I wouldn't have bought it given what I know now but I would have ordered it from the library repeatedly.
