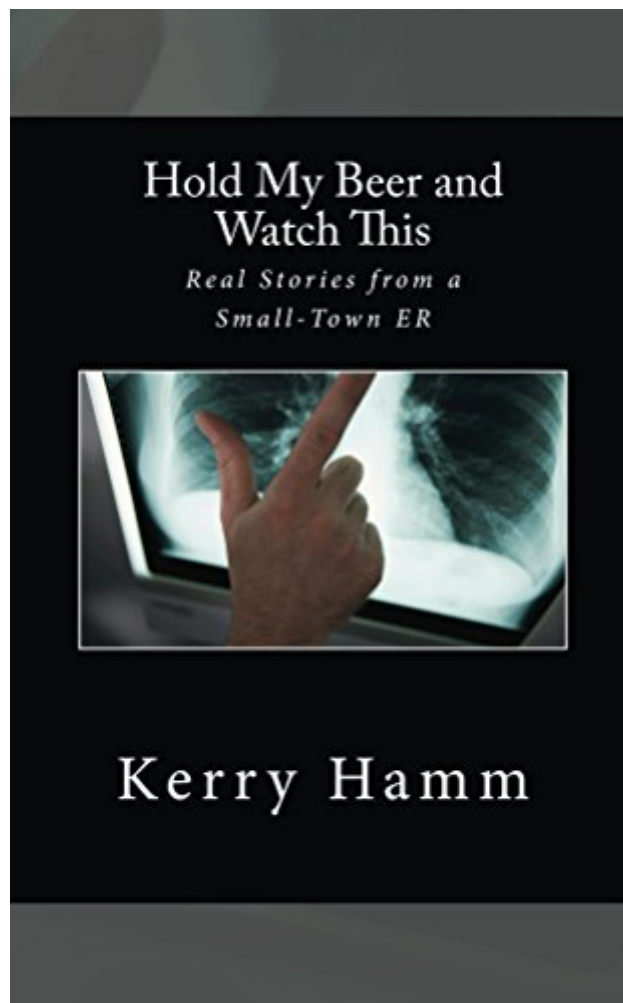




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Hold My Beer And Watch This: Real Stories From A Small-Town ER
