

Great for anyone who wants to know about the damage caused to women by abortion. It is not only the unborn who are hurt. There are two victims, and the woman often lives with a lifetime of trauma.

This was a truly great book. The author makes the case that abortion is bad for women. So many times the pro-life movement is seen just as people who support the fetus. The abortion debate seems to have the baby on one side and the mother on the other. Recall Abortion turns that generalization on its head. The author is one of the founders of Silent No More, which is an organization that has gathered the negative abortion testimonies of many thousands of women. She really knows what she is talking about. The book contains heartbreakingly personal stories from women, including stories of women who were raped and had abortions. She challenges those who embrace abortion in the "hard cases"- i.e. rape, disabled baby, etc. She also discusses the pill and how it can cause early abortions. This was a weakness in the book- she does not back up the part on the pill with science and studies to prove this, but seems to simply accept the research of others. If she had cited studies and things, I would be able to check out the evidence for myself. As it is, I have to take her word for it, and that isn't enough. The writer is a devout catholic who opposes birth control. and that turned me off a little, I am an atheist, but I did not find the religious content too overpowering, and it's my opinion that noncatholics could get a lot out of the book. The women's stories were heartbreakingly real, and really helped me realize that women are also victims of abortion. There were even some stories from former clinic workers in the book, which I thought rounded it out nicely. I would have liked the author to have written a longer book and gotten more in

depth in explaining her points; that and the lack of scientific evidence in the Pill chapter were the only negatives of the book. Normally, such serious flaws would have me knock off a star, but the rest of the book was so good that I can overlook these shortcomings.
