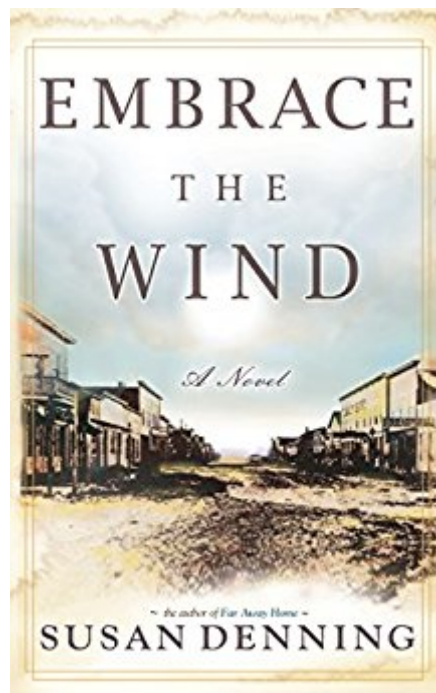




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EMBRACE THE WIND: An Historical Novel Of The American West (Aislynn's Story Book 2)
