

Tim Rayborn is a musician with special knowledge of medieval and renaissance instruments and music. He is a very skilled performer and singer. He is a scholar of medieval history and, as is apparent here, a grandly entertaining historian and humorist. These short, well-researched little essays are both entertaining and informative. These are bite sized essays on colorful people embroiled in even more colorful circumstances sometimes by fate and sometimes by their own doing.
