Very Well Researched...

I concur with Mr. Cox's 10/26/09 review. Many of the ideas proposed by Mr. Feather are intriguing to a lay reader like myself, but I found his "proofs" too speculative and supported by "evidence" that appears to be nothing more than his own hypothetical reconstructions. I am not even an amateur archeologist, but even so, I can see some problems with "research" conducted like this: While walking around one Qumran gravesite (a single visit he made in April 2000) Mr. Feather saw a palm frond on one previously excavated grave, and on no others, and he uses this as one piece of "evidence" to support his claim that John the Baptist is buried at Qumran. This leaves me (pun intended) thinking, "Ummm, this frond hasn't laid there for 2,000 years, so how is this evidence of anything?" He also found a "pattern" in the otherwise unmarked graves (identified by irregular piles of whitish gray loose stones): some of the piles of stones included one or two dark stones of different sizes (Sacre Bleu!). He jumps from this observation to conclude, "[the] larger the brown marker stone, the more important the individual buried beneath it." This is pure speculation on his part - there isn't even an archeological consensus on who used the gravesite or when the graves were dug (mainly because of the Israeli prohibition on further grave excavation), so making a determination that different color rocks mean anything is only a guess. Furthermore, as with the palm frond mentioned above, what evidence does Mr. Feather have that the piles of rocks have sat undisturbed for 2,000 years? If there is any, he didn't mention it. There are example after example of similarly weak supporting evidence used to "prove" Mr. Feather's hypotheses. While I found the concepts interesting and entertaining, I couldn't get past the large gaps in the evidence, and the poor logical reasoning... this detracted from his otherwise interesting views. As a result, I can only say the book is conceptually intriguing, but not compelling. On an unrelated note, I also read Mr. Feather's book "Black Holes in the Dead Sea Scrolls" and while I had similar issues with that book, it also includes a nice narrative about the people and controversies around the research and publication of Dead Sea Scrolls, and it was a much better read for me. There is quite a bit of overlap between the two books, so I would recommend Black Holes over this one.

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
