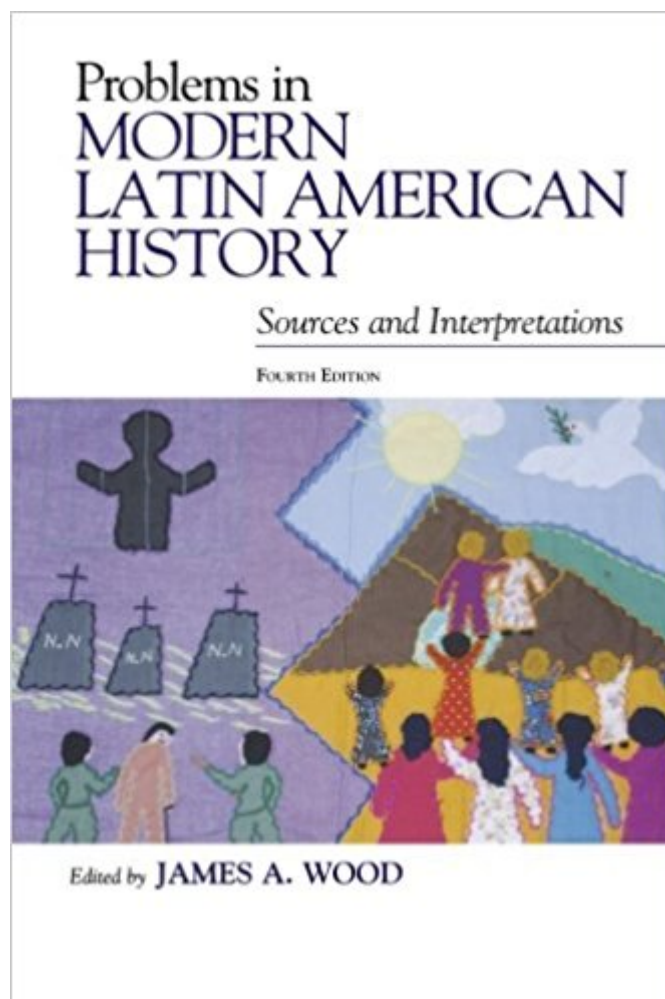

This potent combination offers an ideal means of instructing students in historical interpretation and historiographical criticism. James Wood helps instructors and their students focus on vital selected problems, thus avoiding the usual pedestrian compilation
