

David Weisner has allowed his imagination to run free in *Tuesday*, and the result is a wondrous and mysterious picture book that mixes the ordinary with the unimaginable. He's merged his talent with the palette and his penchant for odd perspective to create a book where frogs careen through suburbia on flying lily pads, startling witnesses and spooking a dog. And that's just for starters. *Tuesday* has few words and no human protagonist, relying instead on a surreal and supernatural vision. The book, for children ages 5 years old and up, won the 1992 Caldecott Medal. --This text refers to an out of print or unavailable edition of this title.

Tuesday is one of my favorite children's books of all time. I've bought several copies for my best friend's kids and even one for myself. David Wiesner has a great way of taking a "What if" situation and turning it into a story that's great for all ages. In the case of Tuesday, that "What if" question is "What if frogs could suddenly fly on lily pads?" and the results are magical.

My daughter and I loved this book when she was small, and we'd spend a long time on each page talking about what was happening, what emotions the people and animals were probably feeling based on their facial expressions and circumstances, and what was funny about the pictures. She's grown up now and I can't find her copy of the book, so I just bought another one to share with the 5-year old next door. Same experience -- he thought it was funny and liked the pictures, and we spent lots of time talking about each page.

This book is one of the best children's books I've ever purchased. It's creative, beautifully done, sparks the imagination in children and adults. It's fun and funny. You can feel the fun and excitement the frogs are experiencing as they fly around on the lily pads. The illustrations are wonderful and even after "reading" it many times, I still find new things to talk about in the pictures. Love, love, love this book and have given it to many nieces, nephews and friends children.

Unusual things can happen any day of the week, but this particular Tuesday was full of flying amphibians. Just wait until next Tuesday! The detailed pictures are the whole story with time notations throughout the night to mark the strange events. Delightful!

I have also given this to non-English speakers (the images surpass any language barriers) and with children who speak little English -- the story lends itself to rich vocabulary development (vocabulary is supplied by the person reading the story, mind you-- I think there's less than 10 words in the whole book.)
