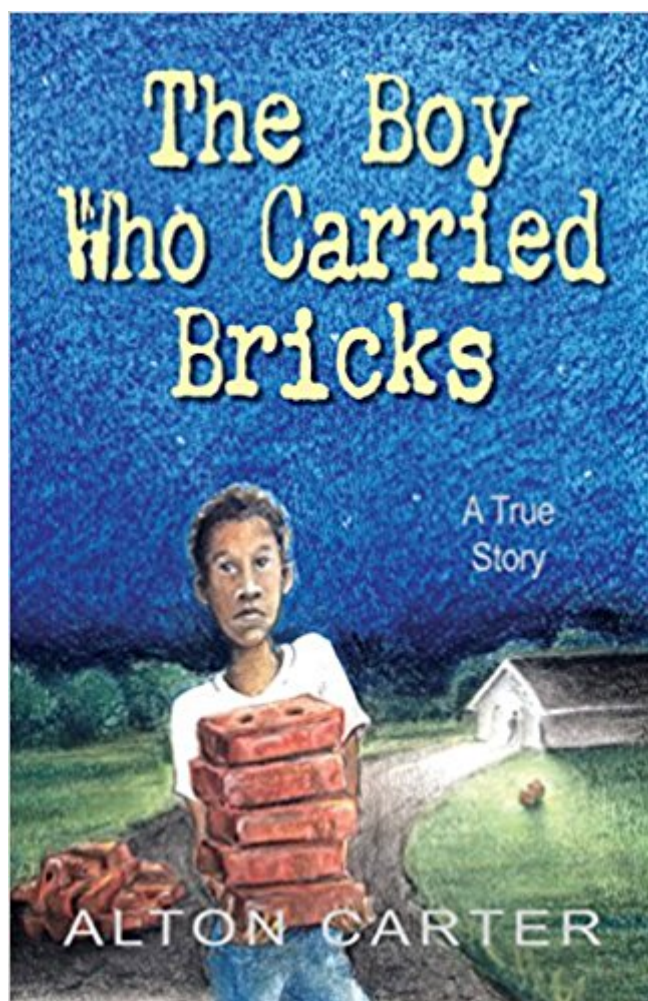


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The Boy Who Carried Bricks: A True Story Of Survival (Middle-Grade Cover)
